Limits Off Campus Housing



Zoning Code

On March 13, 2008 an amendment to the City of Boston's Zoning Code regulating off campus student housing went into effect. This amendment provides *a group of five or more students sharing an apartment, single family house or any other dwelling unit, is a violation of the Zoning Code. (Student is defined as a full-time undergraduate at a post secondary educational institution.)*

University Accountability Requirement (UAR)

In accordance with University Accountability Ordinance (UAR) all secondary schools operating in the City of Boston must submit a report containing the total number of students residing in off-campus units and enrollment status. The data must also include: the students address including unit number and zip code. Units believed to be occupied by more than four undergraduate students will be subject to an inspection.

Ensuring Safe & Sanitary Housing For all Boston Residents



Compliance inspections will include but are not limited to the following:

- Rental property owners must register their rental units with the City of Boston, Rental Registration Program.
- Property owners (who do not reside in the building) must post their contact information (name, address, telephone number) in the common hallway.
- Rental units must be equipped with working smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Units must be clean, sanitary and free from conditions which may endanger the health, safety and wellbeing of an occupant or the general public.
- Property owners are responsible for compliance, violations will be issued against the property owner.
