



COMMUTING AROUND BROOKLINE



- → Green Line B branch runs from the footsteps of BC's Chestnut Hill campus along N. Brookline.
- To get to Green Line B, commuters often take Green Line C to the Cleveland Circle stop, walking to the Chestnut Hill stop (Located at #1).
- e. Coolidge Corner & Wa
 - → Taking Green Line C branch to Kenmore Station can bring you to downtown. It conveniently starts at the Cleveland Circle stop!

- This is Green Line D branch, the longest--but fastest--line on the Green Line, running from the suburbs, through Brookline, directly to downtown.
- → You can take Green Line D branch to the Chestnut Hill stop and walk ~10 minutes to campus.

Average Times to Commute to Campus*

- Walking: Unpopular in winter as from most departure points it takes ~1 hour to walk to BC.
- Driving: 10-15 min. (Note: Limited street parking).
- MBTA: 15-30 min. depending on T line.

*Commute times are averages based on normal road and/or weather conditions. Please stay up to date on local road work and forecasts.
