

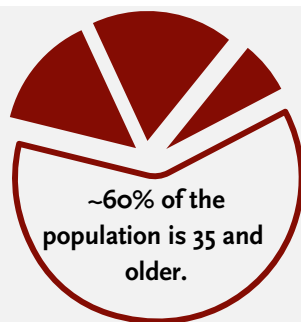

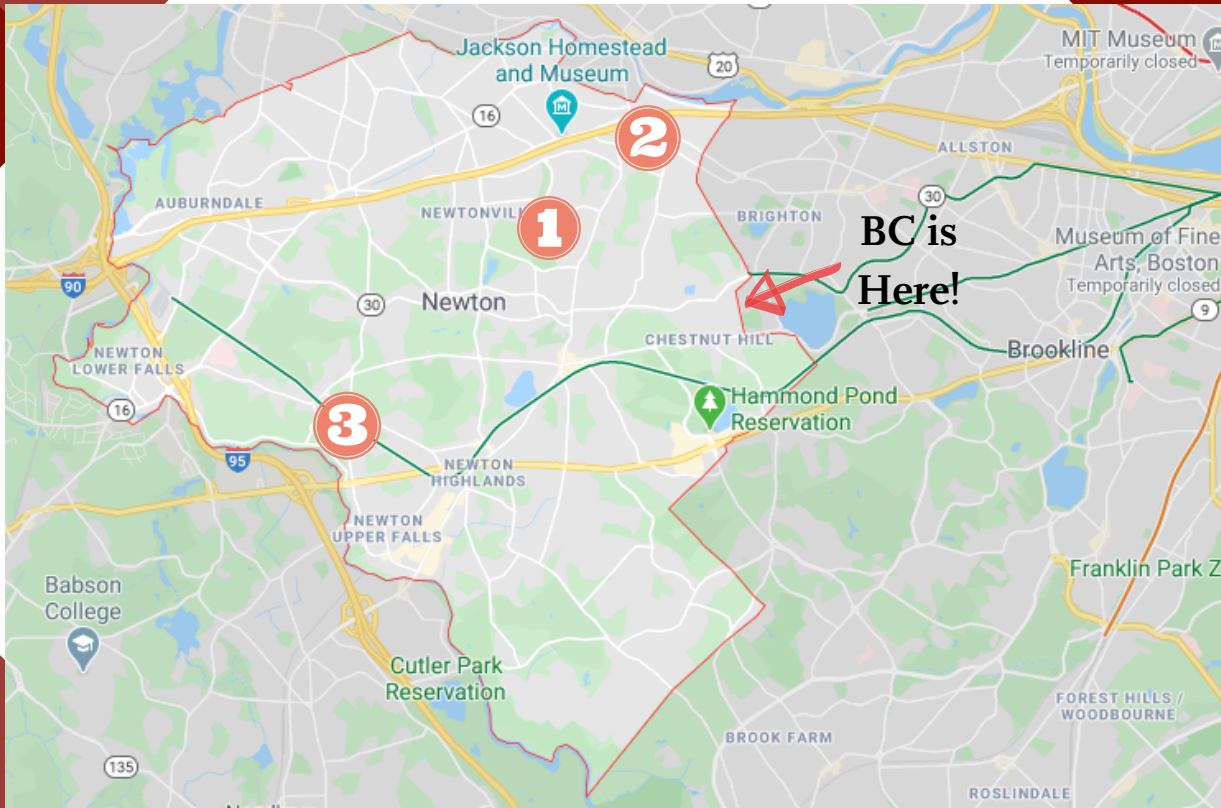

COMMUTING AROUND NEWTON



1

- This is the Newton Campus BC Shuttle stop. Routes vary, running between the Newton and Chestnut Hill, and Brighton campuses.
- The Newton Campus, home to BC Law, has a bus stop at the main entrance on Centre St.

2

- The 57 Bus runs from Watertown Yard to Kenmore--the main bus and T hub that connects to downtown Boston!
- The 57 Bus cuts through Newton on the way from Watertown to Brighton.

3

- This is Green Line D branch, the longest--but fastest--line on the Green Line, running from the suburbs, through Newton, directly to downtown.
- You can take Green Line D branch to the Chestnut Hill stop and walk ~10 minutes to campus.



Average Times to Commute to Campus*

- Walking: 20-30 min. from most departure points.
- Driving: 5-10 min. (Note: Limited street parking).
- MBTA: 30 min.-1 hour depending on proximity to T Line and bus stops.

*Commute times are averages based on normal road and/or weather conditions. Please stay up to date on local road work and forecasts.
